

**Report of the PSSNY Sundowning Committee  
June 2007**

**Members**

**Charge**

- The Committee is charged with categorizing passed resolutions to ensure that all necessary actions regarding the intent of the resolutions are carried out in full by the association.

**Active:** Current resolutions that still require action

**Archived:** Current resolutions that no longer require action but are still reflective of the mission of PSSNY

**Rescinded:** Outdated resolutions that no longer require action and are not reflective of the mission of PSSNY

**Actions**

- The Committee reviewed the 3 resolutions passed at the January 2007 Midwinter Conference:
  1. PSSNY accepts the recommendations of the Sundowning Committee for categorizing passed resolutions. (1/07)  
**RECOMMENDATION:** Archive because completed (Category: PSSNY Business)
  2. PSSNY should seek introduction and support of legislation that would prevent predatory below cost products and / or contracts.  
**RECOMMENDATION:** Active (Category: Practice Issues)
  3. PSSNY supports that all insured individuals should be provided by the new insurance carrier a transition period of at least one 30-day fill for their existing medications when the patient's insurance coverage changes. Furthermore, PSSNY should seek legislation to amend the Insurance Law to mandate this change.  
**RECOMMENDATION:** Active (Category: Practice Issues)
- The Committee reviewed the previously passed resolutions and recommends a change to the following resolution: PSSNY supports the proposed change in the NYS Pharmacy Practice Act that states, "No prescription shall be dispensed unless there is a direct interaction between the pharmacist and the patient or the patient's care giver." (6/98)  
**RECOMMENDATION:** Rescind because no longer reflective of the mission of PSSNY; the proposed change is no longer active and another resolution adequately addresses this topic (Category: Mail Order Pharmacy)
- For ease of reference and to prevent duplication, the Committee arranged all previously passed resolutions into a formal PSSNY Policy Book. The Committee made minor grammatical changes to resolutions to allow for consistent tone throughout the Policy Book. This Policy Book should be made available to the PSSNY Board and to Delegates at the Midwinter Conference and Annual Convention.
